LIFTING OF MOURNING RITUALS

- (a) 'Lifters of mourning'. The symmetry can be seen clearly with eight mourners from Rewa (the chief mourner in black on the right hand end) facing eight 'lifters' from Ekubu, dressed in ceremonial *masi*. Note also that the Vatulelean contingent are seated on a *i-tadratadra* that is a piece of *kumi*, whereas the Rewa mourners sit on a pandanus mat (their *i-yau*).
- **(b)** Laying out the presentation *kumi*. The mourners and 'lifter' women having exchanged their outer clothing and carried away their spoils, the Nalimolevu women prepare their

kumi to process with and present to the mourners.

- **(c) Processing:** the Nalimolevu women with their *kumi* held aloft. The large thatched house is Cakauleka, the meeting house of the second 'house' of Nalimolevu, Cakau.
- (d) Heaping the gifts of the *kumi* and other *masi* the women have brought for the mourners.
- **(e) Mourners removing the pile** of *masi* and mats for division among them.
